WHAT'S ON

NATURE NOTES

The colours and scents of the garden mark the seasons. Yellow primroses, daffodils and dandelions in Spring, followed by bluebells scenting the damp air with their subtle perfume. Riotous colours of Summer, vibrant in the sunshine and then the orange, rusts, golds and browns of Autumn giving way to the red berries of haws and holly, hips of roses and white of Christmas rose and snowdrops peeping through the snow.

Flowers are so much more than a seasonal delight in the garden. We use them to mark special or important occasions in the circle of life; the birth of a new baby, birthdays, weddings, to say thank you, to cheer someone up, when someone is ill or when someone has died. They say what words cannot and they can bring joy where there is none and symbolise even more.

Flowers and scents evoke memories. A particular memory for me is from the time we lived abroad and my friend Joya, a local Muslim lady, called one morning. Her slender frame was hidden behind a mass of glorious orchids spilling from her arms. Fragile, waxy blooms of vivid orange, purest ivory silk, hint of lemon, Granny's favourite lilac, royal velvet purple, cream and gold, bold butter-yellow, Queen Mother blue and shades from the palest delicate pink of a newborn baby taking its first tremulous breath to the voluptuous scarlet of a harlot's lipstick.

There were tiger orange and black bands, blotches, blushes, spots, stripes, streaks and faded speckles like on a blackbird's egg. Dainty petals shaped as spiders' crooked legs, ladies' fans or the folded wings of a gorgeous butterfly. Some flowers were tiny, timid and inconspicuous, pure and virginal with the faintest of scents.

Others were bold and brassy, alluring with pursed lips and throats of honey, but they were all exquisitely beautiful. I will never forget Joya nor her precious gift. It was a gift to say thank you, and it was a joy to receive.

Next Steps for Curate Revd Claire Curtis

The Archdeacon of Exeter, the Venerable Andrew Beane, says, 'Along with Bishop Jackie, I am grateful to your Rector Steph for acting as Claire's Training Incumbent; it is a considerable amount of extra work alongside managing a busy rural mission community. Whilst theological education prepares curates for ministry, it is working alongside an experienced colleague and 'getting stuck in' that truly shapes a curacy.

Here's an update from Claire:

Dear Friends

'Rural ministry surpasses all my expectations, I feel embedded in it and God's calling into it. God is gracious, and I am so grateful for my curacy and to Steph, the team and all of you for your kindness in sharing your lives with me. Building teams together, sharing both joy and pain, and praying for and hoping for the best in each other

Loving with God's unconditional love is what I have learned the most from the EVMC. The confirmations of faith, pastoral lunches, life events ministries, live nativity, holiday club and choir at the cathedral will all be up there, and the hornet up my cassock will conversely be down there in my experiences!

Over the coming months, Andrew and I will be developing our retreat space, a place of hope and healing for young and old across the Diocese. We love our neighbours and will continue to have an open door. Alongside priestly duties, I'll be exploring different expressions of worship. I've fallen in love with you all and will be praying for you from the saddle into the future, waiting on God and watching how he uses us all next... Sending love.' Revd Claire

Often, towards the end of a training curacy, the curate will apply for a new post in a different area and move away; however, with Self-Supporting Ordained Ministers, like Claire, who is rooted in the local area the situation can be a little different and so I'll work with her and the Rural Dean to explore what might be possible for Claire. The Church of England is indebted to its growing number of Self Supporting Clergy who offer their time, skills and experience for free alongside their stipendiary (paid) colleagues and serve in our parishes, mission communities, chaplaincy and in pioneering roles.

This now means after a period of discernment and looking towards the future, Claire will be able to apply for posts and be appointed to her own parishes. Claire will continue to be a licensed priest living in the Exe Valley. She is likely to take some time to explore different expressions of ministry across the Diocese. Please keep Claire, Andrew and their family in your prayers as together we seek God's will for the future.'
