



NATURE NOTES

As I write this at the end of January, it is difficult to imagine Spring will ever arrive. One day is full of promise with blue skies, the birds singing and a little bit of warmth in the sunshine. The next day, one needs waders and an amphibious vehicle.

I feel so sorry for the burrowing animals – all those little bank voles, shrews, moles and even rabbits, whose homes must have been flooded most of Winter. Moles may not be so popular with the farmers and keen gardeners, but I don't mind them. The freshly-dug soil is perfect for potting up seedlings and topping up the greenhouse.

All of those creatures have a role to play in the ecosystem and I have only recently realized the important part that dung beetles play in our lives. Okay, one doesn't much fancy their diet, nor their living accommodation, but did you know that dung beetles are vital in our ecosystem? The UK has more than 40 native species in four groups: 'Dwellers' spend their entire life cycle inside the dung pad, while 'tunnellers' spend more time beneath the pad, burrowing below to build brood chambers and burying dung for their larvae to feed on. 'Stealers' often take advantage of tunnellers by occupying tunnels for the development of their own larvae and stealing the already buried dung. The fourth type, 'rollers' has more competition for the dung; hence the dung beetles roll it away before burying it in brood chambers to keep it from competing beetles.

There are approximately 6000 species of dung beetles around the world with most feeding on dung although some

will also eat dead animals, rotten food and fungi. Some species can use the light of stars or even the Milky Way to navigate their dung-ball push. Their strength is incredible – the representative strength among them is the bullheaded dung beetle, which is the strongest insect on earth, moving more than 1000 times its own weight

Dung beetles may be small, but their impact is immense. These industrious little insects maintain the health and balance of ecosystems: they break down and decompose animal dung, thereby recycling nutrients, they aerate the soil, control pests, disperse seeds, and sequester carbon. In fact, dung beetles provide 'ecosystem services' to the UK cattle industry valued at more than £367 million per year.

The importance of these fascinating, unobtrusive little creatures is such that research is being carried out regarding the benefits to our farms and there are even dung beetles' websites specifically for farmers!







Memories of Brian Stone - A very decent man by Roger Bartholomew Sadly Brian passed away on Christmas Day, a thanksgiving service was held at St Peter's on 24 January.

My first time to meet Brian was in the kitchen of Bakery Cottage. He said very little and was mostly concerned with 4 across, 7 down, six letters beginning with C. Needless to say, my mother got there first, without using the dictionary. And then I mentioned how Devon fisherman were being disadvantaged by the French in the English Channel. I never had to worry about Brian being quiet again. His opinions, backed up by the Daily Telegraph, ensured that conversation was never wanting – add weather, gardening and joint pains and the next 16 hours were taken care of.

the next 16 hours were taken care of. Brian and my mother had so much in common - the garden, the church, music, books, Devon, Oakford - an inexhaustible source of knowledge. After my mother died we suggested to him that downsizing and having everything within walking distance would be a good idea and before long he had moved into Luke St. in Bampton. My son Andrew spent a lot of time with Brian and my mother in Bakery Cottage and knew Brian well and learned the RAF attitude of "do it properly, do it now". While going through the house in Luke St. a brief profile of Brian was unearthed which stated: "Stone, B.R.J. has been a pupil at this school since September 1950. He has ability quite up to the average for a Grammar School boy and on the whole he has worked quite well during his time here. conduct has been entirely satisfactory and he has nice manners and a pleasant personality. EH Peel Head Corbin. Master Huish's Grammar School, Taunton, July 21, 1955". Some things/people never change! I would like to thank Ben, my brother-in-law, for passing this to me.

Anybody who takes that reference through life is going to be remembered as A Very Decent Man. It also makes me realize that this was written a year before I was born!!

Brian had strong roots in the Oakford Community and then from 2015 lived close by in Bampton, where as well as bell-ringing and singing in the choir, got to know his way around the coffee shops and restaurants, anything in walking distance. And in the last 12 months, Brian even learned how to use a mobile phone, although reception in Luke St is like the twilight zone, so if you every tried calling him, don't feel bad if you never received a response. However, if you did get through there was no such thing as a quick 5 minute chat!

What are the endearing memories of Brian? The RAF, Professional Gardening, contributing to the Church and the Community, never turning down a cup of tea, taking on Andrew, my son, to help him meld with Devon & England (including cricket), pushing on through adversity and ill-health, and having time for people. He valued tradition for the right reasons and I will always remember him fondly as A Very Decent Man.

Our thoughts and prayers and good wishes go to anyone in the parish who is ill at home, or in hospital.


